Third Year	Honors year, Dissertation or Research Project, Degree award: B.A and BSc	Honors Year or Study Abroad
Fourth Year	Degree Award MSc	Honors year, Dissertation, Degree Award: M.A. or BSc

How does the admissions process work in the UK?

1. Minimum criteria for each course is defined -> Example provided here
2. Conditional offers based on predicted grades
3. For a few universities and courses there is a selection process and students have to compete in it.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Standard

38 points overall with 18 at Higher Level, including either 6 at Higher Level (either Analysis and Approaches or Applications and Interpretations) or 7 at Standard Level (Analysis and Approaches) in Mathematics

IB points

- Standard entry grades: 38 (HL 6,6,6), including HL6 in Mathematics and SL5 in one of the following subjects:
 - Biology
 - Chemistry
 - Computer Science
 - Geography
 - Geology
 - Physics
 - Psychology.
